



WKPD Bi-Monthly Report – November/December 2023


Waukesha Police Crime/Service Statistics: In the month of November, the City of Waukesha Police Department (WKPD) responded to or initiated a total of 3,725 calls for service. In the month of December, the WKPD responded to or initiated a total of 3,782 calls for service. The total number of calls for service handled by WKPD during the 2023 calendar year was 51,501. The following statistics represent a portion, but not all, of the total calls for service handled by WKPD. ***Note: Similar classified calls have been combined to give a simpler and more complete representation of calls for service handled by patrol. The provided data is preliminary and subject to change.








Messages from the Department



Our department has recently been notified of individuals posing as Sergeants requiring a fine be paid for missing a summons. This is a scam! As a police department, we do not accept payments for fines over the phone. If you do receive a call like this, hang up and call the non-emergency phone number to verify. WE Energies also does not accept payment utilizing gift cards. Trust your gut! If something feels wrong, it

most likely is! As a reminder, no company accepts payment with gift cards. If payment is given utilizing a credit card, call your credit card company or bank immediately to cancel the payment. If a check is passed, let the police department know immediately and we can help cancel the check!

911 Hang Ups

Every month our dispatch center receives hundreds of 911 cell phone hang ups. Often these are from accidental pocket dials or people accidently pressing/swiping the SOS function. "Well, what should I do if this happens to me?" Great question! Well, if you realized you called 911 stay on the line!! The dispatcher may ask if there is an emergency. If not explain that it was an accidental dial. They will most likely ask for your name to update records and the location to verify their mapping program for 911 calls. If they call back, answer it and explain the above



information. Our dispatch center has limited amount of 911 lines and these can often be taken up by these accidental dials. Please do not hesitate to call 911 in real emergencies!

Nightly Lock up



It's that time of year in which people are cruising around windows down and feeling the warm breeze. They pull into the driveway while the kids are playing outside and go on with their night forgetting about their vehicles and garage doors. It's also that time of year in which criminals are creeping around your neighborhoods looking for valuables in your car in the middle of the night. Make sure you 9pm check list is completed. Secure your car, light

up the house, and close any open doors/windows. WKPD sees an uptick in entry into autos during the warm summer months. Cameras can be beneficial for these investigations.

Crisis Response Unit (CRU): The City of Waukesha Police Department and Waukesha County Department of Health and Human Services have joined forces and created a Crisis Response Unit. This unit is a co-response team consisting of one Crisis Clinician and one Crisis Intervention trained WKPD patrol officer. The focus is on sustainable, solutions-based community crisis outreach that is both response and prevention focused. Law enforcement is often the first call made to address mental health concerns and a joint response with local Crisis Services was found most effective in these circumstances. CRU may coordinate voluntary transports for mental health treatment, facilitate safety Plans and/or approve Emergency Detentions, such as Chapter 51.15s or 51.45, among other services. The unit operates Mon.- Fri. except major holidays. The WKPD prioritizes CIT training for all patrol officers to better meet the needs of their community. The Crisis Response Unit has found great success in the short time that it has been active. For more information about CRU visit the police department website.

Emergency Contact Information Form: Business owners of the city, we are asking that you complete the Emergency Contact Information Form to assist with patrol response. Having to track down a business owner or keyholder of a business can take a lengthy amount of time. This allows the police department to have up to date key holder information in case of an emergency or an alarm in an instant. It's a simple form to fill out and email back to the Neighborhood Engagement Unit.



Waukesha Police Public Safety Cadets: Do you have a child aged 14-21 or know someone of that age that is interested in law enforcement? Here at WKPD, we seek to



mentor, educate, and positively involve youth in police operations, while promoting service to their community. Cadets will actively participate in training programs, practical experiences, and activities that not only better prepare them for a law enforcement career, but also emphasizes the role of first responders.
